Dear Parent/Guardian:

With the recent events in Florida and neighboring school districts, we would like to provide you with information on the ongoing efforts at Nebraska City Public Schools to keep students safe.

Student safety continues to be a top priority for our district and we have many procedures and systems in place. First and foremost, we have an excellent working relationship with the Nebraska City Police Department and local EMS services. The NCPD and EMS services are regularly touring and training in our facilities to become familiar with the buildings and layouts, so in case of an emergency they are familiar.

As a staff, we have brought in trainers from School Security Services to provide a Standard Response Protocol and training for all of our staff. We continue to bring the trainers in to provide training to new staff members. The Response Protocol we have trained on is similar to the protocol used by the NCPD so terminology and procedures are similar.

For our students, we conduct regular drills to prepare for a wide range of emergencies, including active shooters.

As parents/guardians you play an important role in communicating and reinforcing school safety procedures with your children, including checking phones, social media and other communication devices. Parents/guardians can also reinforce with your children that if they see something that does not look right or hear something that does not sound right, please tell a trusted adult at school or home. If you see something – say something!

The safety of our students is and will continue to be a top priority, and we appreciate your support.
